English

Our Write Stuff: This term we will be exploring exciting vocabulary, learning about different sentence structures and grammatical features. We will be working on the story We are going on a bear hunt! We will be looking at describing words for our 5 senses. We will also be retelling the story using our own words and creating a different ending to the story.

Maths

In Maths in EYFS this term, we will be focusing on counting confidently to 20, identifying one more and one less from any given number from 1 to 20. We will be learning how to add and subtract any number between 1-20. We will be looking at shapes, in relation to Tangrams, how do we make large shapes, using small shapes. We will learn how we rotate shapes in Tangrams that will enable the child to make another shape.

PE

The children will be learning about different ball and bat skills on a Monday with the PE coach. He will be teaching the children different athletics skills. Starting with running. On a Friday we will be working in the hall on gymnastics.

In RE we will begin by looking at the Story of the Boy Who cried Wolf. We will discuss the story, asking such questions as: How did the villagers feel at the beginning and why did the boy tell lies. We will discuss honesty and why it is important to be honest.

Our LMTW topic is COME FLY WITH ME.

We will be looking at different countries, tradition, national dress and food.

We will be working on how to be confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of a challenge.

We will be looking at some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries, drawing on knowledge from stories, using non-fiction texts and maps.

We will be making props using different materials, which children can use in the role play areas to enable story telling.
