English

Our Write Stuff module is 'The Journal of Ilia, A Young Slave,' a diary based on the Roman Diary by Richard Platt. We will learn about gladiators, how they trained, where they fought and how they could earn their freedom through successful fighting / competition. Some of our writing criteria includes; exclamation marks, colons, question marks, synonyms, time adverbials, use of repetition for effect and look over similes and metaphors. Year 4 will review pathetic fallacy.

Maths

Each morning, as they enter class, they will do Retrieval Practice of previous modules and keeping it alive! We also want the children to work hard, at home, on their times tables to support learning in class where we are continually using and applying times tables in everyday maths.

Year 3:

Measure, Length and Perimeter and then move onto Fractions module B, studying fractions of numbers, and going over equivalent fractions.

Year 4:

Fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, as well as looking at decimals.

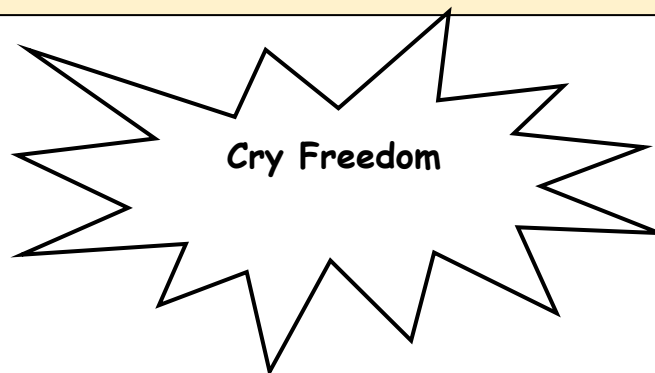

Learning Means the World – Our Wider Curriculum

This term, our Adventurers are learning about Slavery - Past and Present. The topic is called 'Cry Freedom.' We have defined slavery and servants and will learn about slavery in Europe, Asia, Africa and America. Although we will be studying History of slavery around the world, we will also be looking at Geography, Science, PSHE, Music, Dance and Art. We will look at the abolition of slavery and learn about modern day slavery, including child labour. We will look at the online International Slavery Museum, place events, people and changes on a timeline using AD/BC. We will compare their lives with other people around the globe. We will also look at what it means to have 'Human Rights', as well as how to treat others.
