Learning Means The World - Go with the Flow!

This is a fascinating thematic unit focused on the human body and how it keeps us alive, with a key emphasis on science. We begin by exploring how humans grow and change, before learning about the circulatory system, how the heart works and what blood is made of. We will investigate how lifestyle choices such as diet, exercise and substances can affect our health, and carry out practical enquiries such as what activities most affect heart rate. We will also compare human systems with those of animals, learning how living things survive and stay healthy in different environments.



RE

This term, UKS2 is learning about: How far is belief in the resurrection important to Christians today?

The focus in the run up to Easter is the resurrection, what it means for Christians, looking at the different accounts of it and the evidence as to whether it actually happened.

English

This term, we will be exploring the features of a biography using Little People, BIG DREAMS: David Attenborough by Maria Isabel Sanchez Vegara as our stimulus. Through studying this text, the children will develop their understanding of the key features of biographical writing. By the end of the unit, the children will write their own biography, incorporating the writing techniques and features they have learned throughout the term.

Maths



This term, all three classes will focus on fractions, decimals and percentages, learning how to convert between them and apply their understanding to reasoning and problem-solving tasks. Later in the term, we will move on to perimeter and area, where the children will calculate the perimeter of shapes and use formula to find area.

The children will also continue to with the weekly short arithmetic tests to allow us to check for understanding and refine our lessons accordingly. .

Children will develop their skills in cricket and work towards playing competitive matches, led by specialist coaches from Performance Sports. They will also be learning the rules and key skills of netball with coaches from MNR.
