- The purpose of these dictations is to practise accurate spelling.
- The dictation routine we use in school is as follows:
 - > Write the sentence while you are writing encourage your child to start reading the sentence.
 - Practise saying the sentence until your child is confident and fluent recalling the sentence.
 - Ask your child to identify any tricky words and circle them.
 - Ask your child to identify any trigraphs/ digraphs/ split digraphs/ alternative sounds and underline them.
 - > Give your child one last chance to look at the sentence and then cover it up or hide it.
 - Ask your child to write the sentence.
 - > Check the sentence together.
 - > Remind your child to check and correct their spelling.
