Find out about community helpers such as doctors, shopkeepers or refuse collectors.</p> <p>Make a poster which includes of the people who help in our local community.</p>	<p>Road Safety Practise crossing the road safely using the Green Cross Code.</p> <p>Draw yourself crossing the road safely and label key steps such as stop, look, listen and think.</p> <p>Write about the Green Cross Code using the sentence starter "To cross the road safely, I must..."</p> <p>Take photos to show how to cross the road safely and add captions explaining what is happening.</p>	<p>Be an Environment Helper Tidy, recycle or water plants.</p> <p>Draw around a hand and write or draw one way you helped the environment on each finger.</p>
