

English - The Write Stuff: This term's writing unit will be based on the 'RSPB First Book of Birds'. The children will be developing their writing skills by planning and writing a non-chronological report. As they write, the children will be encouraged to include a variety of writing techniques from the Writing Rainbow, such as onomatopoeia, alliteration, adjectives, using 'and' to join ideas, questions, headings, sub-headings, topic information, a picture and a caption. In addition to this we will be focusing on supporting the children's transcription skills (spelling and handwriting) and using full stops, capital
