



To begin this academic year, the children in UKS2 will be learning about Winston Churchill in the British Bulldog topic.

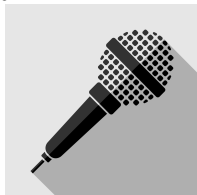

Create a digital fact file all about Winston Churchill.

Include pictures, fun facts, and short captions about his life, achievements and famous speeches.



Listen to one of Churchill's famous speeches (try "We shall fight on the beaches").
Write your own short motivational speech for a modern-day audience — maybe your class, school or community.



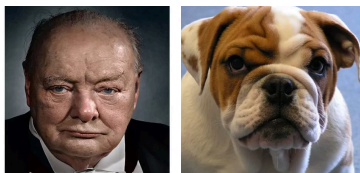
Design a wartime propaganda poster that might have been seen in Britain during World War II. Think about the slogans and images used to encourage courage, community and commitment.



A fact about Winston Churchill is that he loved painting to relax and think. Try painting or drawing a landscape in his style — perhaps a British countryside scene, a garden, or a seaside view. Use bold colours and strong brushstrokes.



Churchill was often compared to a bulldog — brave, stubborn and loyal. Draw or model your own British Bulldog mascot and write a short paragraph explaining how it represents Churchill's character.



During World War II, many foods were rationed, so cooks had to be creative! Research a WWII ration recipe (like carrot cookies, potato scones, or eggless sponge cake). Have a go at making it with your family — then write or illustrate a recipe card to share with the class.
