What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is extra funding schools receive to support eligible children and improve their education.



Who Should Apply?

- Children eligible for free school meals (FSM)
- Families receiving certain benefits, such as:
 - Universal Credit (with income threshold)
 - Income Support
 - Jobseeker's Allowance (income-based)
 - Child Tax Credit (below threshold)
- Children who:
 - Have been eligible in the past 6 years
 - Are looked after / previously looked after
 - Have parents in the armed forces (Service Pupil Premium)

Even if you're unsure, it's worth applying – the school can check for you.



How would the Pupil Premium funding benefit your child?

- Free or subsidised:
 - School meals
 - Trips and visits
 - Uniform or equipment
- Extra academic support
- Enrichment opportunities:
 - Clubs, music, sports
 - Wellbeing support



This funding helps your child succeed and access more opportunities at school.



Benefits for the School Community

Trinity Primary School utilises the Pupil Premium funding to support the children's learning and development and improve educational outcomes.

We support eligible pupils to become more confident, motivated individuals, by providing opportunities for cultural, personal and social development.

Every year we publish a Pupil Premium Strategy on our website—this details how the school intends to spend the PPG funding received for the forthcoming academic year, based on the needs of the individual pupils eligible for the funding.

Every application helps the school provide more support for all children.

How to Apply...It's so Easy!

How to apply:

- Talk to or e-mail the school office and the school will apply on your behalf.

The information you will be asked to provide:

- Name
- DOB
- National Insurance number



Applying is quick, confidential, and will not affect your benefits.



If you are eligible, your child will automatically receive free school meals when they reach Key Stage 2.

PPG is paid to schools for six years from the academic year after your child received free school meals in school. The funding can move from primary to secondary school.

Service Pupil Premium is paid for six years to schools, for any child who has been flagged as a service child.

What happens if your financial situation changes?

Your child's school will continue to receive the funding for the next six years.
